The University of Toronto invites applications, nominations and expressions of interest for the position of Dean of the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy.

Established by royal charter in 1827, the University of Toronto is the largest and most prestigious research-intensive university in Canada, located in one of the world's great cities. The University has more than 11,000 faculty and staff, some 70,000 students enrolled across three campuses, an annual budget of \$1.7 billion, including \$375 million in externally funded research and \$425 million in research funding in the affiliated teaching hospitals, an endowment of \$1.8 billion and one of the premier research libraries in North America.

The Faculty of Pharmacy is located at the heart of the University's St. George Campus in the Leslie L. Dan Pharmacy Building, a state-of-the-art facility that is home to more than 1,300 students, faculty and staff. The recent enhancement of infrastructure has allowed the Faculty to significantly increase its numbers of faculty members, undergraduate and graduate students. The Faculty offers the following programs: Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy (BScPhm), Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD), Master of Science (MSc), Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), and in conjunction with the Faculty of Arts and Science, the Bachelor of Science Pharmaceutical Chemistry Specialist Program. An International Pharmacy Graduate program is offered through the Continuous Professional Development initiatives. The Faculty is an internationally recognized centre for innovation, discovery and leading-edge education programs in the pharmaceutical sciences. It is at the forefront
